The Anguilla Air and Sea Ports Authority (AASPA) intends to apply a budgetary allocation to payments under a contract for **Provision of Security Services for Private Security at the Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport**. The AASPA now invites sealed bids from eligible bidders for the Provision of Security Services for Private Security at the Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport, as defined within the bidding documents. The contract period is for **one** (1) **year** with the option of (1) **one** year extension at the discretion of AASPA

Bidding will be conducted through Emergency Competitive Bid procedure in keeping with the Public Procurement and Contract Administration Acts and Regulations.

Interested bidders may obtain further information from and inspect the bidding documents at the Procurement Office in the Ministry of Finance between the hours of 8:00am and 4:00pm.

A complete set of bidding documents may be purchased by interested bidders upon payment of a non-refundable fee of **EC\$100.00** payable at AASPA's Corporate Office. The bidding documents can then be collected from the Procurement Office upon presentation of the receipt obtained from AASPA's Corporate Office. A pre-bid meeting and walk-through will be held at Clayton J. Lloyd International Airport on *Wednesday*, 19th January, 2022 at 10:00am.

Bids should be received no later than *Friday*, 28th January 2022 at 12:00noon. Late bids will be rejected. Bids will be opened publicly at the Ministry of Finance on *Friday*, 28th January 2022 at 12:05pm. The GOA/AASPA is not bound to accept the lowest of any bids. This bid process may be cancelled or rejected without any liability to GOA/AASPA.
